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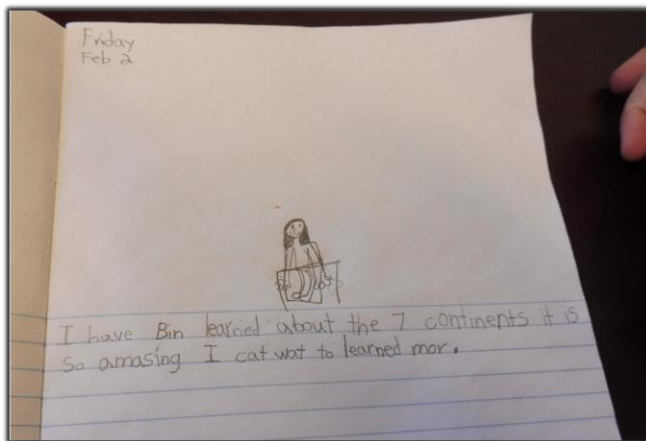
Shine!

How amazing to recognize that it is God’s light that shines in us! Our prayer today is that our hearts will be overflowing with God’s light and that we will shine in the darkness.



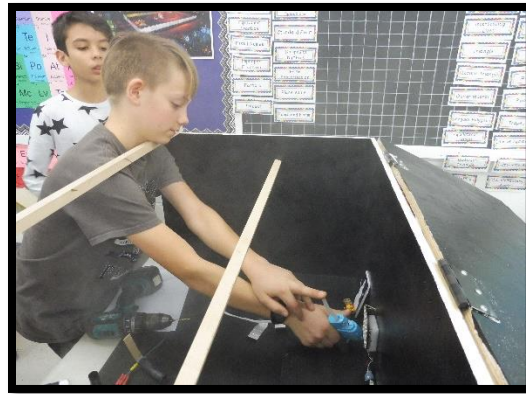
Peek of the week: A joy in my position of principal is to peek into the classrooms and see the learning that is going on. I want to share some of those wonderful moments with you.
