Grade 7/8

Grade 1/2

Spelling: (Test on **Friday**) Students will be tested on their Lesson 25 words on Friday. Grade One is studying the "ou" sound, and Grade Two is concentrating on the "silent h" sound this week.

Bible: We begin our new Bible unit on Moses.

Creation Studies: We are finishing up our mapping unit over the next week and half. We had taken a break to study the tabernacle, but now we are looking forward to finishing our study on the Maps and Globes! This week we will be focusing on hemispheres, and longitude and latitude.

Grade 2 Book Reports: This week Grade 2 students will begin studying parts of a book: character, plot, setting etc... Please make sure they are reading their chapter book each night as next week we will begin their book report in class.

French: We will begin a new play together this week.
