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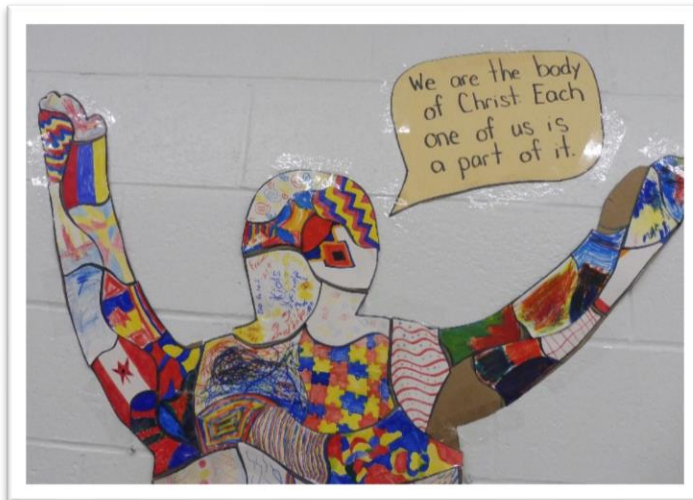

From the Classrooms:

Grade 8

Math: We are working on fractions, decimals and percentages.

Music: We are leading the service in Inkerman on Sunday!

PBL: Students have chosen their individual project and have the next couple of weeks to work on this at home or at the organization. Remember to document what you are doing (pictures, videos, reflections, etc.).

Bible: Memory Work Psalm 8:7-9.

Literature: Next week we will begin a class novel study on "I am David".

Students have a paragraph on writing with emotion due Tuesday.

Language Arts: Grammar – We have finished our unit on verbs and will have a test on Thursday. Students have review sheets to work on to help them while studying.

Gym: We have been enjoying Fitness Centres on Fridays. Students have been learning new exercises to stay fit! We are also looking forward to the warmer temperatures so that we can get outside and start practicing for Track and Field.

Grad Presentations: Students are reflecting on their learning at TCS and should be working on this at home as well as at school.

Grade 5/6

Math: We are working on fractions.

Music: We are beginning to prepare for the Celebration of Learning in May.

The **Grade 6** class is practicing for the service in Inkerman on Sunday!

Gym: We have been enjoying Fitness Centres on Fridays. Students have been learning new exercises to stay fit! We are also looking forward to the warmer temperatures so that we can get outside and start practicing for Track and Field.

Novel Study: We are almost finished reading the book, *The Breadwinner* by Deborah Ellis, a book about a girl growing up in Afghanistan during the time of the Taliban. It is a powerful book and it is giving us lots of think about as we consider what it would be like to live in a time of war and oppression.

Psalm 8 project: The Grade 5-6 class is focusing on garbage and how we can reduce the amount of garbage we throw out here at TCS. We've heard back from some experts and are

exploring different ways to throw out less. For the past month we have weighed the garbage we throw out each day and have discovered that we throw out an average of 3kg a day. We hope that we can reduce that down to 2kg and maybe even less.

Upcoming Field Trip: Next week Thursday, April 11, we will be going to the Waste Management Facility in Cornwall to learn what happens to our recycling once it gets there. This will also help us learn about how to create less garbage. Permission forms will go home this week.

Bible: Memory Work Psalm 8:7-9.

Art: We are looking for plastic, coloured bottle lids. We need LOTS to complete our school wide art project. Please send in whatever you have so we can begin to sort them.

French: Grade 5 practice reading your pamphlet to present on Thursday.

Grade 6 is putting the finishing touches on their projects this week and are looking forward to sharing these with you. We will share how and when later this week.

Grade 3/4

Math: Quiz for both grades on when to multiply and when to divide in word problems.

Spelling: Lesson 25 due on Thursday. We will have our Spelling Test the following Monday, April 8th.

French: We have begun our new unit “Les Animaux du Bayou”.

Memory Work: Psalm 8:5 NIV due on Thursday.

Science: We are learning many new things about our Solar System. We will be having a field trip sometime in mid-April, so stay tuned for final details.

Grade 1/2

Bible Test (Wednesday): We have finished our unit on Jesus’ Parables and will have our final test on Wednesday. Review sheets and duotangs went home today in student bookbags.

Spelling (Test on Thursday): Students will be tested on their Lesson 24 words. Grade One is studying the “ew” sound and Grade Two is concentrating on the “y” sound.

PBL: Our plants are growing! We are excitedly watching our beans sprout in the Library windows and some of our seeds are already sprouting in our greenhouse! We are having a lot of fun learning how to be “Caretakers” of God’s amazing creation.

French: We are learning about plants, so we know how to share information in both English and French.
