From the Classrooms:

Grade 8

Math: Test on Wednesday on angles, shapes and parallel lines.

French: We are currently working on the imperative in French. Student assignment "l'ange et le diable" due Wednesday.

Bible: We are still working on *Objection 1 – Since Evil and Suffering Exist, a Good God Cannot*. Ask about what we discussed.

Art: Grade 8 students need to think about their tile project and come prepared to get started next week.

Science: We are reviewing our information about forces and energy in preparation for a test next week.

Gym: We continue to prepare for our Field Day on Thursday. Grade 5-8 will help prepare our field on Tuesday. If students could bring in shovels or rakes, that would be greatly appreciated. Thanks!

Grade 5/6

Spelling: Lesson 24 work is due on Wednesday. As this is a review lesson there will be no spelling test this week.

Flight: We will have our final paper airplane flying event on Wednesday. Students will all need to make their most amazing airplane ever and have it at school for Wednesday. They must be able to explain how their airplane has thrust and lift and how it overcomes drag and gravity. Also, we will be having a test on our flight unit the following week, Tuesday, May 21. Grade 3/4
