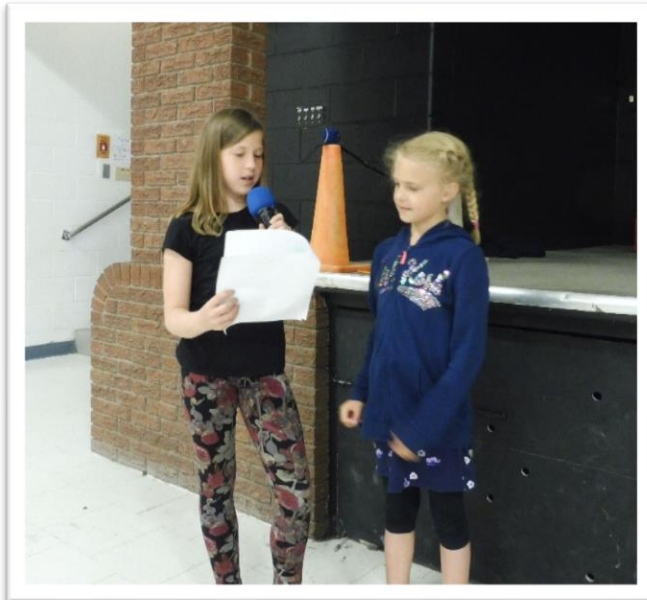

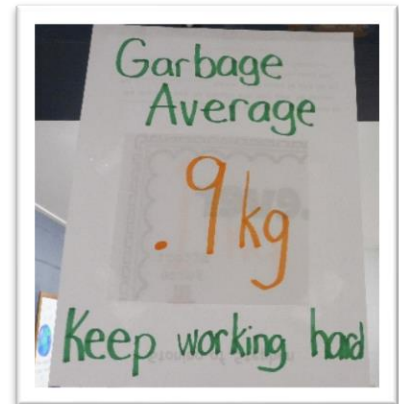

Less Garbage! The students in Grade 5-6 learned about garbage during our Psalm 8 project and they worked on ways that we can throw out less garbage. Since February we have been weighing the garbage each day before it gets thrown out. We had had an average of 3kg. After starting a compost program, revamping our recycling program and encouraging everyone to throw out less our current average for the month of May is 0.9kg! That is a 70% decrease!! Way to go, everyone!
