From the Classrooms:

Grade 7

French: Students will be presenting about a fictional visit they took to a Canadian location. Due: Thursday. ML

Bible: This week students will be concluding our work on Colossians. Review to come soon. ML

Memory Work: some students need to still need to complete this. Check agendas. Colossians 3:12-14 or 15-17 due Friday ML

History: As we finish our unit on Ancient Rome, students have also begun a final project on a topic of their choosing to teach the class. Continue to work on preparing your handout for this project as well as prepare your artifacts or posters for your presentation. ADK

Art: Students are finishing the drawing stage and we hope to begin painting our ad enlargement. ML

Spelling: Unit 7 lesson: Thursday, Test: Friday Students are encouraged to practice. Unit 6 returned Friday. ML

Literature: lesson 5 "Being Alive" due: Thursday ML

Math: We are working on algebra. There will be a quiz on Friday. KG

Science: We are learning about the organelles found within the cell. KG

Music: We are learning how to play scales and read tabs for ukulele. KG

Grade 5/6

Spelling: We will have a spelling test on Lesson 6 on Friday. The students all have a list and a list was also shared with them on their school gmail account. We have started to use a program called [Spelling City](#) to do some of our spelling work. They students all have an account and they are given assignments each week. They can also use the program at home to practice their spelling words. HB

Ancient Egypt: We are coming to the end of our unit on Ancient Egypt. Currently the students are researching some small aspect of Ancient Egypt (for example: wigs, sandals, papyrus, etc). They are each creating a page about their research that will be made into an ebook. Most of the work for this project is being done at school. HB

French 5: Thanks for sending the digital photos of your immediate family and extended family. Students begin writing about them tomorrow. ML

French 6: Students must complete their report on a Canadian Olympic sport. Due: Thursday ML

Bible: This week students will be concluding our work on Colossians. Review to come soon. ML

Memory Work: some students still need to complete this. Check agendas. Colossians 3:12-14 or 15-17 due Friday ML

Art: We began work on enlarging an ad. ML

Math: Our new unit is about place value, rounding, addition and subtraction. We are also working on our times tables, with daily speed drills. Students should have written in their agenda the set of multiplication facts that they are working on. KG

Music: Students should be taking home their ukulele to practice 1-2 times a week. They should practice switching between chords. KG

Grade 3/4

Memory Work: "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding." Proverbs 3:5 due on Friday. This will be our first oral Memory Work, and students should be practicing at home as well as at school.

Spelling: Lesson 7 Test and Unit due on Friday. Grade 3s are learning about words that make the long "o" and long "u" sound; Grade 4s are learning about words that contain consonant blends. Spelling lists are attached in each student's agenda so that they can practice their spelling words at home.

Math: Grade 3s are finishing looking at adding and subtracting with regrouping. We will have a quiz on Friday. Grade 4s are finishing looking at Measurement and will also have a test on

Friday. It will be on the different units of measurement (mm, cm, m, km) as well as units of mass (g, kg)

Science: We are continuing to learn about trees and the different parts. This week, we are finishing learning about leaves and starting to look at the job of seeds to start the growing process of the tree. The students will be working in groups on a mini research project on different types of trees, while there will be a Science test next week sometime.

Bible: We are continuing to learn about Israel's first king, Saul. We are learning about what a king means for the Israelites and the hardships they faced as a result. We will transition into looking at King David later this week.

Art: We began one-point perspective drawings. ML

Grade 1/2

Memory Work: no Memory Work this week.

Spelling: (Test on Friday) Students will be tested on their Lesson 7 words on Friday. Grade One is concentrating on the "Days of the Week", while Grade Two is studying the "soft c" sound. Students should be practicing their words each night at home in preparation for Friday's tests. The next 6 weeks of spelling words were sent home in Agendas today.

Bible Test: (Friday) We have finished our unit on Abraham, and our final unit test will be on Friday. Please review student duotangs at home this week.

Prodigy: In Math, we have begun having a weekly session on the website "Prodigy." This skill-building math program allows students to review math concepts being taught in class while traveling through a fantasy world. At the end of each session, it sends the teacher immediate feedback of what concepts need more review, or what concepts the student excelled at. Log-in information is glued into the front of every student's agenda. Parents can also link themselves to their child's account. Students may log in and play at home as well!

Reading: We have two amazing volunteers, Mrs. Margo VanGilst, and Mrs. Melody Trolly who come into our classroom every Tuesday and Wednesday afternoon. They will be reading with your child and encouraging our class's love for reading!
