Grade 7

Grade 5/6

Math: We are learning multiplication of larger numbers. We are also working on our times tables, with daily speed drills. Students should have written in their agenda the set of multiplication facts that they are working on. KG

Music: Students should be taking home their ukulele to practice 1-2 times a week. They should practice switching between chords. KG

Grade 3/4

Memory Work: "But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people belonging to God, that you may declare the praises of Him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light." 1 Peter 2:9 due on Friday. A reminder that students should be practicing their Memory Work at home as well as here at school.

Spelling: Lesson 8 Test and Unit due on Friday. Grade 3s are learning about words that make the long vowel "e" sounds; Grade 4s are learning about vowel sounds that combine with "r" (ar,

or, ur). Spelling lists are attached in each student's agenda so that they can practice their spelling words at home.

Science: We are nearing the end of our Tree unit. This week, we will look at some of the common trees native to our area and will be reviewing our Tree unit in class. We will have a Science test on Thursday, October 31st.

Art: Students are working hard on learning how to draw sea creatures by studying live video of movements and underwater landscapes in order to add to our one-point perspective art project.
